My research integrates field, molecular, and bioinformatic approaches to focus on the evolutionary history of host-symbiont interactions. Current projects primarily use genomic data to investigate coevolution between birds and their lice, mitochondrial genomics of lice and other insects, and the evolutionary history of endosymbiotic bacteria in lice.
